Thank you for the opportunity to provide you with an estimate for your sod installation! Please don't make the mistake of shopping price by asking, "What is your price per pallet?" We would like to take just a moment and tell you what you should consider when selecting the company to install the sod at your home.



QUALITY OF SOD

We have researched numerous suppliers to make sure the sod we install at your home. It's critical that the soil on the base of the sod is at least 2-3" thick ensuring a good root structure and that the grass is lush and green. Our sod is not cut until we order it. Some companies pickup sod from vendors that has been sitting on the pallet for several days.



EXISTING GROUND PREP

Just like when painting, the preparation when laying sod is critical. We use a sod cutter to remove the existing grass and weeds, as well as, level out any high and low spots. Some companies use a rotor tiller which we do not recommend. The problem that occurs is that the tiller does a great job aerating the soil but over time the soil settles unevenly. We also remove the soil on an angle where the sod meets your sidewalk and driveway. This is a simple but often over looked step that helps the sod not get scalped in the future when using the lawn mower along the edges of your lawn.



LAYING YOUR NEW SOD

We are now ready to lay your new sod. During this process, we will spread a thin layer of enriched top soil to add some nutrients back into the soil to help your grass grow. Each piece of sod will be laid in an alternating pattern to minimize any issues with seams or lines forming.



SPRINKLER ADJUSTMENTS

Keeping your new sod wet is critical to the long term health of your new sod. We will raise (or lower) each sprinkler head so that every head is providing just the right amount of water.



FINISHING TOUCHES

Once the sod has been laid, we will use a 250 pound water filled lawn roller to compress the sod to the soil ensuring all air pockets are removed. This will also help level any remaining high spots. To complete the job, we also use a steel blade edger to trim along the sidewalks and driveway to form a crisp, clean edge.
